

Riding Skills Practice & Kickstart Coaching Day

The aim of the Riding Skills Coaching Day is to encourage riders to ride their motorcycle in a safe and responsible manner. Being the first event of the year, it gives riders the chance to practice some important skills before tackling the challenge of future events. Qualified coaches will guide riders through the skills required to participate in Offroad Riding events safely. Open to club members aged 4 to under 23 years.

Venue Private Property -NARRAKINE

From Armadale head south on Albany Hwy towards Williams (approximately 110kms). Turn right into Narrakine Road and follow for 8.7km. Turn right into Zilko Road and follow for 1.6km and enter farm on your right at the ORCWA signs, follow arrows and signs to parking area

Parking Area

Upon arriving follow signs to parking/pit area. Please park close together and in an orderly way, we have a lot of vehicles to accommodate. Riding of Motorcycles is only allowed in the designated laneways.

RIDING SKILLS PRACTICE & KICKSTART COACHING DAY EVENT INFORMATION Saturday 12th April 2025

What to Bring

Firstly at home, check your bike over to make sure it is clean and well maintained, as you must have your bike examined at the event.

Check you've got all your riding gear as well as water, other drinks & hydration pack.

Snacks & lunch Chair, notebook & hat Fuel & basic tools

Compulsory Gear

Spare sparkplug Spare tube Helmet with AUS standards/Snell Motocross style boots Goggles (no tear offs) Body Amour Motorcycle pants, Jersey & Gloves.

Registration (7:30-8:30am)

Bring your **current** ORCWA membership card or printed receipt, **and** your MA license or one-event license (purchased from Ridernet). Kickstart riders will receive a complimentary One Event License as part of the Kickstart Coaching program.

You will be given a number for the front of your bike, to identify which group you will be with for the day.



Machine Examination (7:30-8:30am) *After you have registered and received your bike number.*

Stick the number on the front of your bike and bring your Bike and Helmet up



to Machine Examination. All other safety gear will be inspected at the start of the session. See website for details on what will be checked at machine examination. Note: Helmet cameras and mounts, along with Tear Off's are banned by order of Motorcycling Australia.

Introduction (8.30am)

It is a requirement for all riders & parents to attend the introduction. Details and format for the day will be announced.

A general talk on bike set up, maintenance, and riding gear will be given.

Skills Practice

Riders will be divided into small groups based roughly on bike capacity and age. A number of skills will be set out within the paddock area. These will include:

Clutch & Throttle control Body position Starts Cornering Braking

Obstacles - logs, rocks, hills, etc Qualified Coaches will give basic instruction on each skill.

Riders will then get the opportunity to practice each skill before moving onto the next skill.

Kickstart Riders (First Time Coaching) Riders attending coaching for the first time will join in with the skills practice. During the lunch break, <u>it is very</u> <u>important riders attend the information</u> <u>session.</u> You will need to bring your Kickstart Manuals. Coaches will run through the theory and rules required to go racing.

At the end of the day, the coaches will 'sign off' your Kickstart Manual, so you





can then apply for your Log Book, which is a Motorcycling Australia requirement to participate in a competitive event.

Competency Assessment

Prior to progressing to a larger capacity bike, all riders MUST complete a competency assessment on the machine they intend to race on, by a MA Accredited Coach.

Any riders requiring an endorsement, must present their log book for signing at the end of the day.

Riders completing the skills practice can be signed off on the following endorsements.

Remember to bring your logbook.

Offroad Endorsements are: 50cc

65 2st / 125 4st 85 2st / 150cc 4st 125/200 2st / 250 4st

Parent Involvement

We welcome parents to follow their children from skill to skill. Please take care especially with younger brothers and sisters. Strictly no other motorcycles / quad bikes to be ridden other than children participating in the coaching day. If you would like to assist on the day, please contact the Coaching Coordinator before the event.

Presentations

Kickstart Riders will be presented with an achievement certificate.

All riders will go in the draw for Spot prizes. Spot Prizes are a random draw from rider entry list. Prizes are either donated from sponsors or purchased as part of your entry fee. You must be present to collect a prize.
