



2025 General Event Entry Information

Specific details for each event can be found on the club website. Click onto the Event Details to find out what to expect, what to bring, and where to come. Below are the details you will need to complete your entry and have a smooth registration on the day.

The most important paperwork to bring on the day are:

- Your 2025 ORCWA membership card (or a printed copy of your receipt);
- Your MA License card OR a printed copy of your one-event license;

To ride, all riders must be a member of the Offroad Riding Club of WA (ORCWA); either annual membership. This can be purchase through Ridernet.

Entering the Event

We have two entry links on the website. One is for Competitive riders, and other is for Non-competitive (trail and sprocket classes). To enter the event, follow the link and complete all your details. You will need to provide information about yourself, your bike, and your parents will also need to include their details if you are riding in a Junior class. Remember to have your ORCWA membership details, and MWA licence handy, because you will need to include these numbers.

If you are unsure which class to enter, or are new to the club, contact the Race Secretary or Event Organiser for more details. It is much easier to ask a question first, than to try and change your entry details once you have pressed 'send'.

Competitive classes:

- To ride as a competitive rider you must have completed a Kickstart coaching course in the past, have a log book and be signed off by a coach in your log book to ride the class of bike you are entering in. You may be asked to show your Logbook on the day.



- If you are a senior, ie: EJ and Under 23 classes you do not need a log book.
- You will also need to have an annual Motorcycling Australia competitive license or have pre-purchased a competitive one event license from MWA. The link for a one-event license is: <http://www.motorcyclingwa.org.au/riders/licence/>.

Non-Competitive classes:

- To ride as a non-competitive rider you need to have an annual Motorcycling Australia license or purchase a non-competitive (recreational) one-event license from MWA. The link for a one-event license is: <http://www.motorcyclingwa.org.au/riders/licence/>.

Motorcycling Australia License

If your Motorcycling Australia (MA) license is not current on the date of the event, and you cannot produce your new one, you will need to purchase a One Event License. It's a good idea to print a copy of your receipt, so you can show this. Remember, it can sometimes take longer than you expect for your new card to arrive in the post. Some of our events do not have mobile phone reception, so a screen shot on your phone is a great back up! The MWA app will also show your license details but phone reception at events isn't always great so make sure you have a screen shot.

Purchasing a Motorcycling Australia License does not automatically enter you into the event. This is a separate process and you will need to do both to ensure you are able to ride on the day.

Volunteering

Our club is run by a dedicated team of volunteers, and there is always room for more. Whether it's helping out for a few hours on the day, or staying over to help clean up on Sunday, your help is greatly appreciated. See our Volunteer Coordinator to find out what you can do to get more involved.
